

#### Chamber members help with bike rodeo

Eagle Point Chamber of Commerce members were very evident at the March 14 Bike Rodeo held adjacent to Butte Creek Mill.

Bob Pinnell, who is president of Safe Kids Rogue Valley and chair of the Chamber's Youth Committee, made arrangements with Kathy Sell, committee chair of Boy Scout Pack 48, to put on a bike rodeo just prior to spring break. Assistance was provided by pack members and approximately a dozen parents.

Also present were some members of the Chamber Ambassadors, including Garland and Eula Arnaud.

About 30 boys participated in the rodeo. Fire District 3 was present and distributed helmets, free of charge, to those who needed them.

Helmets were fitted and information about wearing them and taking care of them was explained.

# Pre-sale of May 12 circus tickets is now underway

The circus will be here before you know it. Culpepper & Merriweather Circus will perform twice on Tuesday, May 12 at the granite field off Nova St. at the high school parking lot.

Circus employees were making phone calls to Chamber members recently asking members if they would purchase tickets that they can give away to children or sell. Pat Jacobson should be receiving the tickets soon.

The Chamber will make 25 percent on all the tickets sold in this manner and 25 percent on all advance children's tickets. Children's tickets sold in advance are \$6 (no charge under the age of two.) At the gate, tickets are \$7 for children.

The Chamber will make 50 percent on all advance adult tickets after selling the first 100. Adult tickets sold in advance are \$8. Adult tickets at the gate are \$11.

Show day the Chamber receives 10 percent of all ticket sales.

If the Chamber sells 200 advance adult tickets, the circus will refund the \$290 we have paid. If we do not sell 100 advance tickets, we still keep the percentages from
