# Eagle Point tandem bicycle stop fundraiser for Chamber

Several Chamber members kept very busy on July 3 assisting at the rest stop at the Butte Creek Mill for the 25th annual Northwest Tandem Rally. Several hundred participated in the rally, but bikes attracting the most conversation were the ones seating four.

Instead of folding up their tent at the end of the day, some riders just fold up their tandem, put in their car and drive away.

The rally was divided into a beginners, medium or experienced ride. The

ride to Eagle Point was a 25-miler from Medford. Others continued to Evans Valley for a total of 55 miles, while some made the entire round trip to Sams Valley, Rogue River and Gold Hill. This amounted to an 85 mile ride.

It was obvious there was a unity with the tandem enthusiasts, yet they remain very individualistic. This was evident by the very colorful shirts, nearly all with a basic pattern, but different colors and information.

## Draft copy of board minutes

Minutes of the May 20 Board of Directors meeting were approved.

Treasurer Hank Rademacher reported a negative income of \$2,748.28.

It was noted in the future the flower baskets need to be in a separate category just as is Avenue of the Flags.

The budget was discussed. It was approved as presented by Sandi Erskine.

The Chamber garage sale only earned \$47. Chamber members simply did not participate. On the other hand, the cheerleaders made \$1,500.

The Chamber was given the opportunity to make \$500 from the Tandem bicycle event July 3, Six people were needed from 9-2 p.m. to hand out water and fruit. Bob Pinnell, Jonathan Bilden and Bob Russell volunteered and they were contacting others to assist.

A variety of items were discussed pertaining to the web site. It was suggested Google be taken off.

Issues regarding the posting of flyers was discussed. These included: Posters be limited to chamber member events or community events; future discussion is needed regarding limiting the number of flyers. Bob Pinnell indicated he liked the idea of limiting the number.

Other suggestions included charging a minimum for a community event if it is a flier that benefits just one group (or member).

It was determined that Sandi and Kathy need to make an appointment to talk with Casey regarding website concerns.

Concern was voiced that the webmaster is updating some things, and not other items. Kathy said she can do the membership updating on the web.

A motion was made that effective Jan. 1 to get a flier on the web site you had to be a current advertiser. The motion died for lack of a second.

Appreciation Night was brought up and needs to be brought up at the membership meeting for participation and support.

Deadline for the Greeters was noted and Jenny Zomerdyk (Independent office) was to send out a reminder.

Kathy was asked to place Garage Sale ads in the Nickel, Ashland Tidings, Tribune, Courier. Bob Russell said he would take care of radio and TV. This was all for the Giant Yard Sale.

The Chamber ad for the end of June in the Independent was to deal with Spam, EP Saturday Market & Vintage Faire, SC Saturday Market.

The subject of a reader board on the highway was brought up. Bob Russell said he would talk to Bunny Lincoln at city hall regarding what can and can't be done. Bob Pinnell said he would talk to Mike Malepsy, who owns the Creekside Center about adding to a reader board.

Joe Riker, consultant (and city administrator for Shady Cove) and Shape for Life were both approved as new members.


