2nd Saturday events

The first "official" Chamber of Commerce 2nd Saturday event was a huge success. Vintage Faire attracted untold numbers from the minute it opened and beyond its publicized closing time of 4 p.m.

Bob Russell, who coordinated the 5th annual event, said "it just shows parking is not a problem. If people want to come, they will find a place to park."

The city council thanked Russell and those who participated and attended for a most successful event.

Next year's event will not be on Mother's Day weekend, but rather will be on the 2nd Saturday in May.

The next Chamber 2nd Saturday event is June 12. This is being promoted as the "biggest yard sale in Southern Oregon." The Chamber has been taking addresses for folks from White City to Union Creek that will have a yard sale on Saturday, June 12. The Chamber ran an ad in the May 25 Upper Rogue Independent listing all the addresses that had thus far called to say they were having a yard sale. Others have since called.

The Chamber will have its own location at Bob Pinnell's State Farm office at So. Shasta and Nita Way. He has the key to a storage unit for those wishing to place items there ahead of time.

Thus far there is no committee for the project. Bob needs to know who can help get things out of storage and who can work the sale.

The Biggest Yard Sale and the Peddler's Faire is being advertised in the Mail Tribune, Ashland Daily Tidings, the Nickel and the Grants Pass Courier, in addition to the Independent. Response should be quite good. Items and help is needed.

May 3, meeting minutes

The regular meeting of the Eagle Point/Upper Rogue Chamber of Commerce on Monday, May 3, 2010 was held at The Club, the new Boys & Girls Club in Shady Cove. Carrie Beebe, of the Boys & Girls Club, said the facility officially opened Mar. 29. It is open three days a week. About 167 boys and girls, ages 11 and up are attending. She said about 50% of them were from the Shady Cove area.

The community raised the dollars needed to keep the facility open, which amounts to about \$180,000 for three days a week. Everything has been donated, included a piano, computers, and so forth.

The report from the Candidate's Fair was positive. Don Skundrick was in attendance at the meeting and said he was very impressed with the turnout.

The minutes for the April meeting were approved.

Treasurer Hank Rademacher reported it was taking time to change banking from Chase to PremierWest. The change came because Chase did not wish to renew their membership.

The treasurer's report was approved.

Bob Russell highlighted the events forthcoming in the Vintage Fair.

A report was given on signs for 2nd Saturday events. The membership approved the purchase from Signs Now of three banners with 2nd Saturday on a red background. There will be one for White City, Eagle Point and Shady Cove.

Bob Pinnell has keys for those wanting to put things in the storage unit prior to the June 12 yard sale. The Largest Yard Sale in Southern Oregon includes a location at State Farm in Eagle Point for the Chamber of Commerce. Bob reported he still needs a committee.
