Circus coming hoorah, hoorah

Your Eagle Point Chamber of Commerce signed an agreement to sponsor Culpepper & Merriweather Circus, on May 12. It is a family circus, not a carnival event. There are dogs, camels, trapeze performers, horses, among other performances.

This is an exciting opportunity for the Chamber to earn some money. The Chamber will get 25 percent of the pre-sale children's tickets and after the first 100 adult tickets are sold, the commission to the Chamber is 50 percent. If a minimum of 200 adult tickets are sold, the Chamber will get the \$290 fee already paid for the event returned.

Pre-sale tickets are \$6 for ages 2 to 12 and \$8 for adults. Children's tickets sold the day of the performance will give the Chamber a 10 percent commission. Performances will be at 5 p.m. and 7:30 p.m. The show will be on the granite field at the high school.

They can seat up to 700 in the tent. We have assured the city we will have a lot of Chamber members present to act as eyes and ears over the crowd. We have some ideas, will be signing volunteers up to assist at the event and to sell tickets. And volunteers are an absolute must. Please come to the March meeting prepared to assist. This will be a major topic at upcoming meetings.

Baskets or not

The City of Eagle Point will not be able to fund the petunia baskets this year because of necessary budget cuts made to balance the budget.

The baskets were extremely popular last summer and something many have said they wanted to see continue. However, they are far from free. Last year was the first year for Tim Ebert and Four Seasons to get involved in the hanging and daily care of the baskets. He lost money on the project.

This year baskets will cost \$329 each for the season, which runs May-October. That is \$65 a basket. The Chamber contributed last year, but most of the cost was paid for by the city. This year, if we are to enjoy the colorful addition to our city, each of us is going to have to support it.

Bob Russell has volunteered to head a committee and asks for a couple of people to call him and volunteer. Ebert needs to know if Eagle Point is going to do the baskets and how many baskets the city will do by early March.

Last year the city had a total of 52 baskets. Bob Russell is hoping the community, groups and individuals can support 35 to 40 baskets. Please call Bob at 826-3531 to say you will do a basket and/ or assist him in the project.
