The Eagle Point/Upper Rogue Chamber of Commerce hosted a town hall session with Senator Doug Whitsett R- District 28) and Representative George Gilman R-District 55) on Thursday, Sept. 3 at the Ashpole Center. They provided an overview of the recent session and provided their opinions on the state of business in Oregon. About 50 or so voters attended. Questions were wide-ranging with several expressing concern over the lack of rent controls for mobile home parks. Rep. Gilman announced he would not seek another term. Two Republicans have announced they are seeking his seat. They are Mike McLane from Powell Butte and Mike Wendel from Prineville.

Tips to prevent personal and business fraud

PremierWest recently hosted a luncheon to warn their business customers regarding fraud. While we will not detail their program in this article, we feel it is important for businesses to know some of the more recent techniques in use and to offer some warnings applicable to anyone with a checking account.

Most of us have small businesses and most of us live in small towns, which can lead to being a bit lax with safety measures. Warnings listed by the Oregon Bankers Association include:

• Keep payroll checks in a locked

safe. And keep your check supply in a safe place, perhaps at a location such as your home if you don't have a safe.

- Have employees store their valuables and personal items in a secure place, preferably a locked area.
- Don't leave your workplace unattended when strangers are present.
- Password protect your computers and any sensitive software programs.
- If possible, have an alarm system installed or add deadbolts to your door locks.

Other pointers include:

- Be aware of someone applying for a job, especially if someone else arrives and there is an attempt to distract you or an employee.
- Beware of emails that may come from a foreign country saying that you or an employee has won something or that they were hired to work from home.

No one is invisible from those intent upon defrauding us.

Check with your bank for any special programs they may offer to further protect your funds.

How do you get a reluctant child to wear a helmet?

- Establish the helmet habit early when your children get their first bike, or any wheeled vehicle.
- Let them pick the helmet out, they are more likely to buy into the idea. If you are a grandparent send a gift certificate instead of a helmet.
 - Wear a helmet yourself and be a role model.
- Encourage their friends to wear helmets. Peer pressure can be positive.
- Talk to them about why you want them to protect their heads. Let them know: bikes are not toys, but they are their first vehicle.

Include use of a helmet when you talk about bike safety.

Point out all the sports professionals that wear helmets, from batters to race car drivers. Reward your child for wearing a helmet and do not let them ride without having a helmet on.

Plan bicycle outings together when all family members wear their helmets. Ride with a local bike club if you can, where all riders will probably be wearing helmets and many of them, like the racers, are accomplished riders.

Remember: Crashes causing head injuries can occur on sidewalks, driveways, bike paths, and parks as well as streets. You and your children cannot predict when a situation will occur that will end in a fall from a bike. It is important to wear a helmet whenever riding even if it's just down the street or on a bike trail.
